### **MUSIC TEACHER OF THE YEAR 2017**

Margaret Ann Randolph was recently named Music Teacher of the Year by the Ocoee Music Teachers Association and the Tennessee Music Teachers Association. TMTA presented its award at the conference at UT Martin. The criteria for the award include teaching, educational background, service to local and TMTA music organizations, and participation in the arts community including performing.

Margaret Ann Randolph (MAR) has belonged to music teacher associations in Illinois, Cleveland, TN, Ocoee, TN, and Chattanooga, TN. In 1976 she cofounded OMTA. She has served on the TMTA Board as both Junior High Chair and Elementary Chair. She has also been President of OMTA. MAR has attended several MTNA Conferences, other National and International Institutes and Festivals, and local masterclasses. She was also a cofounder of Junior Festival (part of NFMC) in Chattanooga in the early 1990's and is a member of Piano Guild. "Miss Margaret's" students have successfully participated in local and state auditions; some have majored in music and some still are active in music careers. Local music involvements include: Active and past Board member of the MacDowell Club; First Vice-Pres. of Chattanooga Music Club; Cleveland Music Club; Charter member of the Cleveland (Chatt.) Symphony Guild. She wrote reviews of the CSO concerts held in Cleveland for the local paper. Other: former AAUW member with a name grant in her honor; listed in Personalities of the South, and was a member of Mu Phi Epsilon.

Margaret Ann is a solo pianist, duo pianist, chamber music player, and accompanist. She has been a church organist and directed adult and children's choirs. She has a B.M. degree in piano performance from Birmingham-Southern College and an M.M. in piano performance at the University of Illinois. She has taught privately for many years, has been on the faculty of the University of Illinois and adjunct at CSCC, TWC, and Lee University. Married to Sheridan over 40 years, they have three grown children.

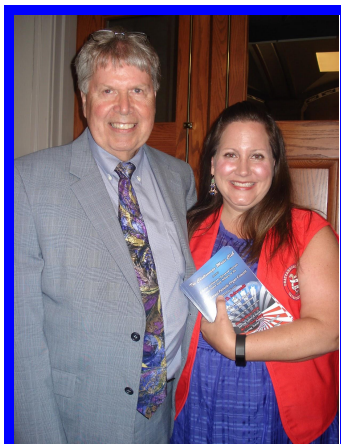
**ORGAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE**
