Patriotic Concert, June 26, 2018



Richard Hills (b. 1980) is one of the very few musicians to have mastered both the classical and theatre organ worlds. He studied with William Whitehead at Rochester Cathedral, then had organ scholarships at Exeter College Oxford, Portsmouth Cathedral and Westminster Abbey with teachers Rosemary Field and David Sanger. He now combines a freelance solo career with continuo, choir training and teaching. He is the Organist of St Mary's, Bourne Street, London.

Richard's theatre organ career has been equally prestigious. The American Theatre Organ Society named him 'Organist of the Year' in 2010. He made his solo debut at the BBC Proms in 2013 and was also a soloist in the 2015 season. His has recently recorded British music on the magnificent dual-purpose Compton organ of Southampton's Guildhall, which earned a five-star review in Choir and Organ magazine.

He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists and is Musical Adviser to the UK's Cinema Organ Society.
